Sign on and welcome to participants by Dana Offerman.

- Dana asked those who are attending the meeting for the first time to identify themselves. No new members were identified.

Speaker – Tricia Sauer, Arizona Indivisible Coordinator

- National Indivisible has declared Arizona a battleground state. This is a two-year program with the goal of turning Arizona blue. Arizona District 06 (Juan Ciscomani) and Arizona District 01 (David Schweikert) are targets.
- The effort will be led by Arizona Indivisibles and will consist of teams.
 - a. Statewide Messaging and Strategy Team which will utilize social media, in-person actions, and bird-dogging of Ciscomani and Schweikert.
 - b. AZ-01 and AZ-06 action and accountability teams will follow policy and legislation by these representatives.

- Wisconsin is having a hotly contested supreme court election on April 4, 2023. What is really on the ballot is reproductive rights. We will be working with FT6 to send postcards to Wisconsin to promote two progressive candidates. You will be notified as soon as possible as to the logistics.
